Every day there is a constant stream of people dropping in to light a candle and say a quiet prayer. It is, a heart for the city and an active house of prayer.



A Unique Musical Education



- Choristers from the Palestrina Choir and the Girls' Choir come from all over Dublin and its environs.
 - The choristers benefit from structured training in singing and vocal development, sight reading, musicianship and musical theory, liturgical repertoire and Latin.
 - Their musical education follows the Royal School of Church Music (RSCM) training, examination and award structure, thus linking the choir with the best worldwide.
- In this endeavour, they have been supported by the educational programme of the Charitable Infirmary Charitable Trust.*
- Many former choristers have gone on to successful careers in music or as top professionals in their field.
 - This all-round musical education helps to broaden a chorister's horizons, facilitates them in singing in different languages and presents them with unrivalled opportunities.



Contribution of the Choirs

- Weekly participation in Sunday Mass Liturgies – Girl's Choir - 10am, Palestrina Choir - 11am.
- Friday evening vespers, benediction and mass – Palestrina Choir.
- Tuesday evening mass – Girl's Choir.
- Participation in all major liturgical celebrations in the Archdiocese – Holy Week, Easter and Christmas ceremonies.
- Singing at State occasions – 1916 Centenary commemoration at Arbour Hill, State funerals.
- Annual performances of the Bach St. Matthew or St. John Passion, Handel's Messiah, Pergolesi's Stabat Mater and Fauré's Requiem, alone or in partnership with other choirs.
- Participation in the International Organ Festival since 1980.
- Annual Christmas Concerts at the National Concert Hall, Dublin.
