It is refreshing also to note the renewed commitment by the Church for the Pastoral Care of the elderly, a group of people who have suffered greatly during the Covid-19 pandemic due to being isolated from family, from their faith and from many of their daily supports.

IDEAS FOR YOUR PARISH TO MARK THE WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY

- Host a Mass of Thanksgiving on the weekend of 24/25 July with a focus on the celebration of Grandparents. If possible invite Grandparents to be part of the Mass or to join in online if we are restricted by Covid-19. Include those in care homes.
- Grandparents' Book of Remembrance: Invite parishioners to share the names of Grandparents and elderly members of their family who are no longer with us in a Parish Book of Remembrance. The book can be brought to the altar at the start of Mass on the weekend of 24/25 July.
- Join in online with the celebrations led by Pope Francis in Rome (details to be announced).
- Acknowledge a Grandparent or an elderly person with 'The Grandparents Medal' award from the CGA. A commemorative medal is available from the CGA for use for this purpose. As well as giving them the commemorative medal for display, you can also present them with a CGA gold or silver medal to wear.
- 'Passing on the Faith Podcast' project a living faith audio archive in your parish with members of the parish youth group interviewing Grandparents to create an archive of faith stories.
- Host a Novena or Holy Hour for Grandparents and the Elderly on the eve of Sunday 25 July.
- Display prayers from the Children's Prayer Appeal in your church on the weekend of 24/25 July. Make some of these available to local care homes.
- Talk to us about establishing a Grandparents' Ministry in your parish which could be launched to coincide with the World Day of Prayer on the weekend of 24/25 July.
- Forget-me-not flowers are the official flowers for Grandparents. These might be included in the liturgy or seeds might be passed on to grandchildren to grow in memory of their Grandparents.
- Send a group to your National Grandparents Pilgrimage in 2021. (eg Knock, Walsingham, etc)
