Theological Orientation



- A Synod is a gathering of people, or priests, or bishops that helps the Church move forward together
- Last Synod in Ireland was in 1850
- A synod is not a parliament or opinion poll
- Synod is an ecclesial event
- Synod is a Spiritual Experience
- If the Spirit is not present, there will be no Synod
- Synod is a place of encounter not of confrontation

Theological Orientation



- This synod begins locally by the people of God listening to each other and to the Holy Spirit
- This synod is a two-year process rather than a one-month event
- Synodality is about the way we are Church together
- A synodal Church walks together in fraternal dialogue
- Aim is to give the entire Church as a lived-experience of synodality
- Don't just talk about it—live it.

Scriptural Orientation



1. The periphery

- Hear, O Israel: listening and listening again.
- Peripheral vision.
- Peripheral hearing.

2. The Acts of the Apostles

- Emerging community of faith.
- Obvious: Acts 15 (the so-called "council" of Jerusalem).
- Less obvious: Acts 10:1-11:18 (the socalled "conversion" of Cornelius.





3. The Holy Spirit

- The unpredictable Spirit.
- The Spirit beyond our boundaries.
- The Spirit always ahead of us.
- The struggle to attend to the working of the Spirit.





Pastoral Orientation




- The Synodal Pathway is a shared pastoral event
- Three pastoral principles inform the whole process
- Sharing The hopes and fears, the joys and sorrows
- Taking part based on the model of a co-responsible Church and the equality of baptism
- Reaching Out going beyond the parish gates or the door of the Church
- The role of local leaders is to maximise PARTICIPATION
- Building inclusion into the whole approach

Pastoral Orientation



- At local level what will this look like?
- Accessibility so that as many can take part as possible
- Fairness where everyone is treated equally
- Accurate synthesis of responses
- Respect for rights, dignity and opinions
- Clear communication at the levels of invitation, involvement, inclusion and collation of responses



Practical Orientation
