**Introduction**

### Introduction

We begin our *Building Hope* Novena to the Holy Spirit on the Feast of Christ's Ascension into Eternal Glory.



One of the earliest depictions of the Ascension is a page from the Rabbula Gospels in Aramaic (6<sup>th</sup> c.). This image portrays the confusion of the disciples as Jesus Christ is taken up in glory. Mary, however, stands confidently with hands outstretched in the praying position. Here we can see a confident Mary, prayerful Mother of the evolving Church.

### Scripture From the Gospel of Matthew

**“Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit” (Matthew 28:18-19)**

### Reflection

*This is a sample of a prayer and a gesture that embeds sacred ritual in families preparing for the baptism of one of their members. Imagine Mary joining with you. Each evening, when saying ‘goodnight’ to your child, make the sign of the cross on their forehead, saying;*

**‘God bless you and keep you, in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit’.**

*If there are older siblings, you could invite them to do the same.*

**‘The Christian community welcomes you with great joy.**

**In its name I claim you for Christ our Saviour by the sign of his cross.**

**I now trace the cross on your forehead.’**

*The above prayer is based on the prayer of welcome from the Baptism ceremony.*

### **Introduction**

We mark the first anniversary of the Inauguration of Pope Leo XIV who was elected, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, on 8 May 2025 at the Conclave of Cardinals in the Sistine Chapel, Rome.

### **Reflection**

#### **Words of Pope Leo XIV on the day of his election as Supreme Pontiff – 8 May 2025**

“To all of you, brothers and sisters of Rome, of Italy, of the whole world, we want to be a Church of the Synod, a Church that walks, a Church that always seeks peace, that always seeks charity, that always seeks to be close, especially to those who suffer.



Today is the day of the Supplication to Our Lady of Pompeii. Our Mother Mary always wants to walk with us, to be close, to help us with her intercession and her love. So, I would like to pray together with you. Let us pray together for this new mission, for the whole Church, for peace in the world and let us also ask Mary, our Mother, for this special grace.”

**19 May 2026**

### **Introduction**

The suffering of Saint Paul because of his courageous witness to the Good News of Jesus, leads us to confront religious persecution in our own time.

### **Reflection**

**Women of Pakistan**



The number of Christians exposed to persecution and at risk of suffering violence worldwide rose by 8 million people compared to last year—reaching a record 388 million.

### **Intercessions**

**Let us pray for our communities building hope together in their partnerships: that they will promote a spirit of mutual respect for followers of other religions.**

**Let us pray for those who suffer persecution because of their Christian faith: that we will speak up in their defence and lobby for justice where we can.**

**Introduction**

You will be familiar with the letters **IHS** as a design in many of our churches. Saint Bernardine of Siena, whose Feast Day we celebrate today, was the person who initiated this idea to promote our rich Eucharistic inheritance.



**Scripture              From the Acts of the Apostles**

**“Now I commit you to God and to the word of his grace, which can build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified.”      (Acts 20:32)**

**Reflection**

Saint Bernardine of Siena (d. 1444), was a member of the Franciscan Order, the greatest preacher of his time, journeying across Italy, calming strife-torn cities, attacking the paganism he found rampant, attracting crowds of 30,000, ...compared with Saint Paul, he had a keen intuition of the needs of the time, along with solid holiness and boundless energy and joy.

Especially known for his devotion to the Eucharist, he devised a symbol—IHS, the first three letters of the name of Jesus in Greek—in Gothic letters on a blazing sun. This was to displace the superstitious symbols of the day, as well as the insignia of factions: The devotion spread, and the symbol began to appear in churches, homes and public buildings.

Day 5

Thursday of the Seventh Week of Easter

21 May

### Introduction

Courage to speak the truth is one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Both the late Pope Francis and Pope Leo XIV have displayed this gift during their papacy. Saint Paul was brave in his witness and left that grace as his legacy. Those preparing for Confirmation might explore the lives of people of courage and faith such as the late Sr Stan Kennedy, who said; "In the face of the worst that the universe can throw at us, If we have hope, we can endure." (Sr. Stan Kennedy RSC d. 2025)



### Scripture From the Acts of the Apostles

The following night the Lord stood near Paul and said, "Take courage! As you have testified about me in Jerusalem, so you must also testify in Rome." (Acts 23:11)

### Reflection

**One of the many legacies of Pope Francis are the Beatitudes he gave us in 2016.**

"Blessed are those who remain faithful while enduring evils inflicted on them by others and forgive them from their heart."

We are invited to face the challenge of staying true to our values. This can be difficult if we live in an environment of hostility to the Christian message. We might prefer to avoid trouble by staying silent.

In the spirit of the early church, let us reclaim our space of truth in our own time. In the tradition of our Irish ancestors in the faith, we have many witnesses such as the Irish Martyrs who are venerated to this day.

Pope Leo XIV has come under pressure recently for his condemnation of war and the use of the Gospel to justify it.

"I will continue to speak out loudly against war, looking to promote peace, promoting dialogue and multilateral relationships among the states to look for just solutions to problems.

Too many people are suffering in the world today. Too many innocent people are being killed. And I think someone must stand up and say there's a better way."

### Intercessions

**We pray for the Spirit of courage: that we will speak the truth with compassion to those who need Your light regardless of the cost.**

**We pray for the grace of faithfulness: that we will hold fast to the religious traditions that sustain us and never be afraid to share them with family and community.**

**Introduction**

The celebration of the Eucharist is at the heart of the Christian community. People are nourished by the grace of the Sacrament. They are also fed by liturgies that are participative in music and word. People recognise when coordination and effort are evident because of the contribution of a liturgy group.

**Scripture**

From the Gospel of John

When they had finished eating, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" "Yes, Lord," he said, "you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Feed my lambs." (John 21:15)

**Reflection**

"We know how important it was for Jesus to share meals with his disciples, but also, and especially, with sinners and the outcast. Sitting at table, Jesus was able to listen to others, to hear their stories, to appreciate their hopes and aspirations, and to speak to them of the Father's love. At each Eucharist, the table of the Lord's Supper, we should be inspired to follow his example, by reaching out to others, in a spirit of respect and openness, to share with them the gift we ourselves have received. Through the testimony of lives transformed by God's love, we best proclaim the Kingdom's promise of reconciliation, justice and unity for the human family. Our example can open hearts to the grace of the Holy Spirit, who leads them to Christ the Saviour." **Pope Francis, January 2016**

**Intercessions**

**We pray for those who receive their First Communion this year: that they will be nourished and fed at the table of love.**

**We pray for all who minister at the Lord's table: that they will renew their faith and understanding of the gift of the Eucharist and the privilege they enjoy.**

**Introduction**

Listening to God's Word is another source of spiritual nourishment. John, the Evangelist reminds us that his Gospel account is a small window into the words and actions of Jesus during his time on earth. Mary, the great listener, was best placed to hear the Word of God who she brought into the world.

**Scripture**                      **From the Gospel of John**

**But there are also many other things which Jesus did; were every one of them to be written, I suppose that the world itself could not contain the books that would be written. (John 21:25)**

**Reflection**

It is difficult for people to sit quietly with God's Word. We are so used to scanning through messages and news on our phones that we are losing our power of concentration. Brother Richard Hendrick OFM Cap tells us that monks used to pray with short phrases from the Bible. Choose a phrase for yourself.

He describes the practice of sitting with a short phrase, repeating it over and over again and thinking about it like 'chewing the cud'. In the same way that cattle eat, chew and chew before swallowing, we can do the same by simply sitting with one simple phrase.

"We get all the goodness from the scripture and then finally a deep silence falls...we wait for the harp of the heart to be plucked...and a moment of awareness to dawn".

We can do this today and any day using the phrase we have chosen.

### **Reflection from Fr Bill McNichols**

“Pope Francis has spoken beautifully about the Church as Mother. I know he would like to see more women and lay men involved in the decisions and hierarchy of the Church. In this icon Mary is solemn with an ever so gentle upturning of her mouth, as if she is awaiting the arrival of the Spirit, as she did in the first Pentecost. As Mother of the Church, she knows our problems and what is needed most of all right now to keep us all following the Gospels. She knows the Holy Spirit never goes backwards but is always creating anew. Her throne is not made of gold, but Hildegardian greens and warm colours. The Flame of the Spirit hovers above her. Doctor St Hildegard of Bingen saw the Holy Spirit as the “greening agent” of the Most Holy Trinity, and she put these inspirational visions into some of her 77 songs as well. In this era of urgent need to protect Mother Earth, as St Francis of Assisi called her, I have great hopes that young people will be given some “miraculous inspirations/interventions” from the Holy Spirit and help to save our world.”
